The Need

CARITAS

In the early 1980's, P. Leo Corcoran, a successful real estate developer, began to notice an increase in homelessness in Greater Boston. He was surprised to learn how many homeless people had jobs, and yet could not afford a place to live. Caritas Communities was born from the idea that low-income workers should have access to a safe, well-managed place to live that was affordable and provided support to struggling individuals. Today, the need for our housing remains higher than ever. For working people, wages have remained stagnant and market-rate housing costs are out of reach for those at the lowest income levels. In addition to low-wage workers, we provide housing for seniors, people with disabilities, and Veterans on fixed incomes. We also partner with local agencies and programs fighting homelessness to provide housing for their clients.

Most residents arrive in our housing having experienced the trauma of poverty or homelessness. These residents not only need housing, but help connecting to healthcare, job training, healthy food sources, and all available community resources to build a better life. Your support gives hope to those who need it most, many of whom have endured years of stress and hardship, having lived on the streets, in shelters, or in other substandard and unsafe housing.

Work. Housing. Empowerment.

There is dignity in work. For those who are capable, the pride of having a job and paying rent and living expenses is critical to their self-worth. By providing safe housing that is affordable, Caritas empowers low-wage workers to achieve self-reliance and independence. For some, this success can be built upon, offering hope for a better future.

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What We Do

At Caritas Communities, we prevent homelessness by providing very low-income individuals with permanent housing, support, a sense of community, and expanded opportunities. For 35 years, Caritas has helped fill the need for safe, secure housing in Greater Boston. With your support, Caritas helps individuals who have been homeless or at risk of homelessness, including Veterans, people with disabilities or chronic illness, frail elders, minimum-wage workers, previously incarcerated people, or those who, for whatever reason, struggle to earn a living wage.
