



It's no secret that our name can be a challenge.

aniel lost his home in 2015, when the building where he lived in Roxbury was condemned. He lived with an aunt for a while, caring for his mother, who had dementia. Eventually his mother was relocated to live with other family, and Daniel ended up homeless, sometimes sleeping at the Prudential Center in an effort to stay safe. He credits Boston Healthcare for the Homeless with helping him find his Caritas home.

He remembers with gratitude that when he first moved into Central House in 2017, the property manager made sure he had everything he needed to settle in, including a Welcome Basket of home and personal-care items.

Daniel plays the organ for his church and creates beautiful and elaborate décor for church events. "My church keeps me going," said Daniel. He also works as a hair stylist. "I can do anything," he said, "cuts, color, braids, whatever you need."

His goals are to continue his education and move into a one-bedroom apartment. "When Daniel told us he wanted to find a larger apartment, he was afraid he would hurt our feelings," said Fauzia, the case manager at Central House. "But we encourage residents to strive to reach their goals."

"The people here are supportive," said Daniel. "They want to help you." 💗



hree years ago, Amanda lived with her mom, her kids, and her son's father, but then things fell apart. Her son's father became violent and she kicked him out. Her mom sold their house. Her son went with his father and her daughter stayed with her mom. Amanda struggled with drug use and went to live in a hotel. "But still," said Amanda, "my mom worked really hard for me. She Googled low-income rent/homeless prevention and found Caritas. We knew Caritas would be the best option because of low rent and a location within the same town."

"This house gave me a reason to care," reflected Amanda. "I was in a deep depression. Moving out of my home that I grew up in, not being able to live with my children. I couldn't get out of bed to do anything. My mom paid my rent during that time. I started to use again. This is not a sober home but it became

that for me. Jesus, our site manager, became my mentor and role model. He didn't have to do that, but he did because he cares. The other residents became my friends. I feel protected and safe here. Because of this, I am now sober and working at CVS.

"I took on the role of the motherly type because I miss my kids so much. I like to be a caretaker and bring items from CVS to my neighbors who need them. My daughter Rosie and my mom live a few blocks away and come here for dinner all the time. I need to make peace with feeling like I didn't do enough. I have to be OK for myself to help them, and Caritas is helping me to do that."

"Caritas is not a shelter," said Amanda.
"It is preventing homelessness by
providing a permanent home for people
living on a low income. I don't know what
I would have done without Caritas. I now
have so many reasons to care."



Donor Report Card

You make it easy to be green

- Caritas was commended for having achieved 15.86% savings in energy toward a goal of 20% energy savings. "With many competing priorities this past year," wrote Josh Geyer, Better Buildings Initiative Multifamily Sector Lead, HUD office of Environment and Energy, "we commend you for maintaining your pursuit of portfolio-wide energy efficiency, sharing data, and making progress towards your goal."
- New boilers were installed at 1876 Beacon Street and One East Lenox Street, funded by the Lean Multifamily Program, which provides assistance for housing providers to improve energy efficiency and reduce energy costs.
- Sunwealth Solar partnered with us to install solar arrays at 10 properties, reducing costs and our fossil fuel footprint. Installations at additional properties are planned in 2022.





You are helping residents stay healthy

- We hosted 3 COVID-19 Vaccine and Booster Clinics for staff and residents at our property at 820 Mass Ave in conjunction with the City of Cambridge.
- A vaccine awareness campaign promoted the safety and effectiveness of the COVID-19 vaccine to residents, including information and assistance in locating and setting up appointments.
- Your support of our Boston Marathon team raised money for meals and services for our Healthy Residents program.

You are providing dignity in housing

- Funding from Charlesbank Homes and the Hamilton Foundation allowed upgrades to 1202 Commonwealth Ave, including new tile flooring and a beautifully restored front entrance with controlled access security doors.
- The Linn Foundation replaced AC units at Sean Brooke House as well as repaying the exterior walkway and installing controlled access doors.
- Major renovations are currently underway on Dudley Street in Roxbury, Russell Terrace and Fessenden Streets in Arlington, and Eastern Ave in Chelsea, including kitchens, baths, flooring, and security.



Caring for our Communities



You are preventing homelessness

- In 2021, you, our donors, gave \$339,475 in direct rental assistance for residents in need. (Distribution is ongoing. We have not evicted for non-payment during the pandemic.)
- Our Resident Supportive Services Team, funded by you, our donors, helped 293 residents obtain \$966,880 in publicly funded rental assistance grants for arrearages accumulated during the pandemic (through May 31, 2022).






You are supporting effective partnerships

- 15 youth from MoreThanWords have moved from homeless to home with Caritas thanks to funding from the Liberty Mutual Foundation that provides rent and case management support.
- We are partnering with Boston Public Health Commission to provide permanent housing, case management, and medical care for 24 homeless individuals to improve health outcomes.
- 22 individuals relocated from shelters to hotels during the pandemic moved into permanent Caritas housing through a Pine Street Inn Rapid Rehousing program.

You are enhancing our capacity to learn and grow

- Caritas was awarded its third Harvard Community Action Partners project, providing a pro-bono consulting team to help us develop performance metrics to better guide programming to care for our residents and communicate our impact.
- We are implementing a highly customized software platform to manage our resident support programs, enabling us to track activity, measure what works, and practice continuous improvement.
- The Smith Family Foundation has funded the purchase of mobile tablets for supportive services and other field staff so we can meet residents' needs and collect data "on the go."







effrey had been an actor and model in California. He had one-off stints on General Hospital and All My Children and advertisements for Louis Vuitton suitcases. Then his career started to go downhill so he came back to the east. Jeffrey moved to Central House 8 years ago, thinking he'd be here for only one year. He never imagined his life would turn out this way. As a gay man, he was the victim of not one, but two hate crimes, which derailed his life in every way.

On his birthday in 2016, Jeffrey went to celebrate at a club in Boston. At the end of the night, as he waited for his ride, some men came over asking for a cigarette. Before he knew it, he had been stabbed; he almost died. It took him months to recover, but he did. He credits

Central House's property manager at the time for helping him get through it. "I was so depressed I wanted to die. Toni was the only one to come and take care of me. I wouldn't be here without her."

The following year, Jeffrey went out to celebrate his birthday and, at the end of the night, 8 young men beat him up. He did nothing to deserve these attacks. He lost his left eye, his jaw was broken, and he lost some movement on the left side of his body. Major depression set in.

"People think I'm strong. I'm not. But I survived. I struggle with depression and don't know where I'd be without Caritas. I am glad that I am here. The care that I've been shown gave me reason to live. I am so grateful for the friends I have made here and the support from Caritas. I am doing the best I can."




acqueline came here from Haiti 9 years ago with a visa to study and stayed until she got her papers. She has a few cousins in this country but other than that, she is on her own.

Jacqui has been at Caritas for the past 2 years. Prior to that, she was living with friends in the Boston area. She didn't have the credit needed to get her own place or money for first, last and security deposits. Someone gave her a link to Caritas in 2019 and, as she reflects. "I don't know what I would have done if I didn't check out that link. I found a single room. I was so scared and nervous when I moved in I knew that if I didn't try, I would be on the street or somewhere I wouldn't want to be. At first, there were a lot of people who were different from me but in time I have gotten to know them and now Lam comfortable."

Jacqui was working in the after-school program at a school in Arlington. She lost that job when Covid hit in 2020. She now works at Whole Foods. She continues, "I'm so relieved to know that I can stay here for as long as I need. Massachusetts is very expensive. Caritas has been very helpful and does really nice stuff for people."

Jacqui is grateful for the resident services staff who provided her with a Welcome Basket when she moved in, and connected her to Arlington Eats, a local food bank, when she needed it.

"I am still in school for business administration," said Jacqui. "When you are by yourself, it takes longer to finish things. The most important thing for me is that I feel safe and that is the best thing when you are on your own. It is such a relief for me to be here and to know that I will not be rushed out. I want to say thank you."
